SESSION DESCRIPTION:

The workshop will open with a very brief introduction from Saskatchewan's new Single Procurement Service (SPS), including an overview of provincial procurement restructuring. Crowns in attendance may also share their perspectives on implemented and upcoming improvements in their processes.

SESSION DESCRIPTION:

Compliance and business ethics have become topics of increasing importance in the industry. This is the case on an international level but also domestically, especially since the SNC Lavalin corruption issues have attracted wide-spread media attention.

This presentation will focus on two main topics; anti-corruption compliance – introduction to the topic and its relevance to the Canadian construction industry, and implementing a Compliance and Risk Assessment program. This section would focus on additional risk areas, such as cyber security, and provide an overview of the elements of an effective program to manage enterprise compliance with relevant laws/regulations.

ABOUT THE PRESENTER:

David Krebs has a business law practice with particular focus on privacy & technology, regulatory, and compliance. He has worked on comprehensive audits, policies & procedures, strategic training programs as well as transactional documentation, advising clients on Canadian federal and provincial legislation.


