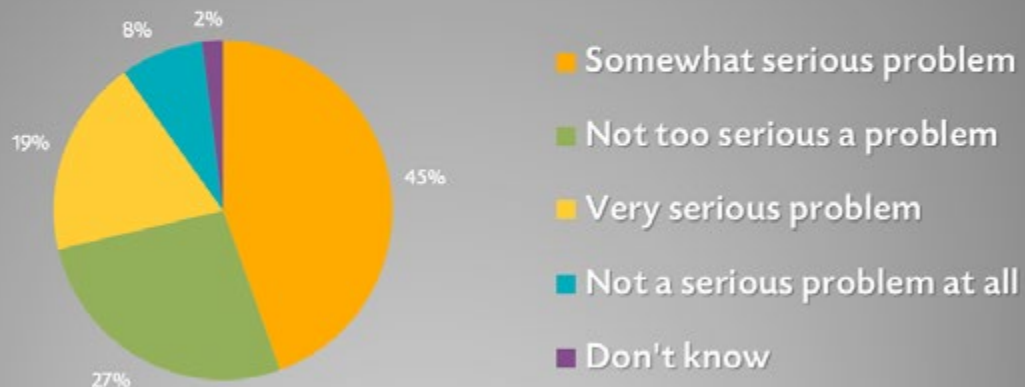

AS WE BEGIN to settle into this next phase of the pandemic, food banks continue to see increased, ongoing and changing needs in our communities. Food banks across the province have shifted and adapted services to anticipate the needs that will continue for many months as government subsidies and community food programs offered from schools and other agencies come to an end and deferred debt from rent, utilities or mortgages become many families' new stressors.

With your help, the 32 food banks across the province are responding to escalating demand for food. Thanks to YOU, families across our province are able to put food on the table during this unpredictable time. Here's

what we're seeing across the province:

- Regina Food Bank: April 2020 demand was up **60%** over April 2019
- Swift Current: April saw an increase in families using the Salvation Army food bank; jumping from 20 to now **35-40 families each week**
- Rosetown: **24% increase** since March
- Saskatoon Food Bank & Learning Centre distributed just over **250,000 pounds of food** in the last two months
- Employment in Saskatchewan: **73,800 positions lost** since February
